GO, GIVE, GATHER

As I was asking the Lord what was on His heart earlier in the year, these were the words spoken through His Spirit. I was led to the book of Acts starting at chapter 2 thinking where the disciples were meeting. They were really overwhelmed with the Holy Spirit, people around them wondered what was going on and made some pretty bold accusations citing their crazy behavior. The disciples stood strong and they spoke in confidence of who He was and what He was doing. Because of their courageous speaking many people came to salvation and knowing the Lord that day, in the 3000's.

This is a time shortly after the resurrection of Jesus and those who are leading did not understand and certainly did not want these kinds of conversations taking place. They opposed what John and Peter were sharing. The people around them were hungry to hear the truth and gathering close to hear what they were saying. As this happened the leaders again took a stand against them, they not only didn't support them or encourage the words they were saying, they flat out attacked them. They put them in jail and they wondered what to do, asking one another what they could charge them with. It says finally they took John and Peter before them and told them not to speak of Jesus's name again. John and Peter boldly asked, "who are we to listen to, you or to God?" The leaders knew that these men were set apart not because they were something special. They were declared very ordinary man, but the power of the Holy Spirit set them apart giving them courage and letting them understand truth. The leaders let them go but they said but do not speak of the power in the name of Jesus. After they were released John and Peter gathered back together with the other disciples and they praised Him for all that He had done through miracles and those coming to salvation. They came together for prayer for strength and for continued courage.

These chapters in Acts, bring so much clarity, so much hope, so much strength in seeing those

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that have gone before us and seeing His power within them. I think that God has a special calling for the church and for those

being called forth in adoption. There will be many who do not understand, who even attack or oppose this very thing, and yet we have the same power within us as the disciples did as we speak in Jesus name. So let it be an encouragement to us in this day, week, year, God is calling and asking for us to go to the orphan. What might seem crazy behavior to man, is perfectly aligned with His heart and His word. He is asking, literally asking, are we willing to go? What is it that we are willing to give? Because we know when He claimed us in our adoption, He gave everything to adopt us, even His very own son. We also know that He understands how hard this is. He understands just as the disciple's encountered difficulties, so do we. Just as they understood the need to come together for strength, that's how He calls us to be as a body of believers, to come together, gathering in the safe and holy place under His name.

"As for us, we cannot help speaking about what we have seen and heard."

Acts 4:20

So whether you're starting the journey or asking yourself honestly if you're a part of this journey, my challenge and encouragement to you is, dust off your feet, shake off your pride, dig in deep to who He is and who He says you are, lean into Him and what He says in His word... Then be willing to go, give all that you have, and then gather together in true community celebrating His faithfulness and the power of His name.

Haiti Orphanage Update

Project update!

Many of you have been asking and wondering about the Transition Project in Haiti at the One Vision Orphanage. Well, we are pleased to inform you that the project has begun! The Board spent many hours discussing the best way to transition our older kids into the Haitian culture, with skills that would make them effective in taking care of themselves as well as the possibility of their own future families. The Board also spent many hours discussing with the director of the orphanage, Dr. Francisco Noel, gaining his perspective on what

would be the most effective way to accomplishing this transition. Together, we decided to scale into this project in multiple phases. Phase one has been started! This includes a few different buildings. A school building for secondary (high school) education, making sure that the older kids complete the education that was started when they were younger. This school will start with normal subjects like reading, writing, arithmetic's, and language skills. Even more, it is anticipated that the school will grow into technical classes teaching skills like sewing, carpentry, nursing, and computer science. Further, phase one includes a building with living quarters for the

older kids to learn how to live on their own, yet under supervision, with the responsibilities of cooking, cleaning, and other household chores falling on themselves also to take care of. A more in depth explanation of the reach and scope of the Transition Project will be coming in a future newsletter. But we wanted to say thank you to all that helped get this Transition Project started by attending the fund raisers the last two springs! With your help, and as I write this, the first building is being completed and will begin to be used no later than the last door is hung and screw in place. Thank you for being an important part of this transition for the kids. ~ Mark Vermeer

Our journey to our newest daughter started with the adoption of our son, Kaikai, in 2012. Kaikai has Spina Bifida, and when we adopted him, we were definitely on a steep learning curve as it pertains to this special need. But with the help of Kaikai's sweet spirit and God's clear direction, we discovered all that we needed to know to care for our son. Within that process of learning, we realized that we didn't want all of this knowledge to go to waste, and we believed that sometime in the future, God would lead us to another child with this special need.

In 2017, the time seemed right to move forward with another adoption from China. We thought that we'd adopt another little boy, but when a friend showed us the file of a precious 5 year old girl who had Spina Bifida, we knew that she was the one. The road to accepting her file was a bit circuitous, and because of unusual circumstances in our lives, there were a number of times along the journey in which we wondered if we would be able to continue with her adoption. But God kept confirming that yes! He was still calling us to adopt this special little girl.

In June of this year, we were given the go-ahead to travel to China! We were excited and nervous, but also confident that God had gone before us. Our son, Kaikai, came with us and his presence ended up being invaluable as we began the process of attachment with our beautiful new daughter, Ruby Xiaohong. We had an amazing trip and were absolutely smitten with our precious gem.

When we arrived home, our other children welcomed Ruby Xiaohong with open arms. Being that they are all significantly older than her, Ruby Xiaohong has the privilege of being the doted on little sister, and she is eating it up. We are so grateful that God has blessed us with this perfect new addition to our family. Having adopted other children, we understand that the transition isn't always this simple, but we also know that if God is leading, it will always be good.

Our special thanks to Katelyn's Fund for their prayers and support for this journey. We know that would not have been able to adopt without the help and encouragement of the body of Christ. Adoption has always been part of our "Plan A". During our engagement, we would dream about making our family and we both expressed the desire for biological and adopted children. We were married in March of 2014 and immediately felt led to grow our love through growing our family. After a couple years of trying, we found out that the other part of our "Plan A" was no longer an option. However, God gave us hearts for the orphans before we knew this. He is good and gave us these desires for He knew His plan for us all along was to be adoptive parents of, not one, but two (we have also been called to and approved for a sibling pair adoption)! Yes, there were lots of challenges to face including the financial burden of adopting. We considered less expensive ways to adopt, but God closed many doors until we walked through the open one leading to India. We get a lot of friends and family asking "Why India?", but really only God knows. We yearned to be obedient to the Lord and His calling but did not know how the funding would work out. Our adoption agency suggested applying for a grant through Katelyn's Fund. We applied and went through the interview process where they p rayed for us and encouraged us in our faithfulness to God's calling to adopt. We remember feeling so blessed by the prayers and the love of the Body of Christ extended, that the grant would have just been a bonus at that point. But the answer to our prayers for provision were a "yes" and "amen" through Katelyn's Fund (Philippians 4:17-20). Not only did we receive this gift as a blessing of provision, but it was further affirmation from the Lord that His calling was for us to adopt (Isaiah 1:17).

Not only did the Lord divinely orchestrate our journey thus far, but He carefully knitted our hearts together to be more for Him in the waiting. Early in our marriage we talked about babies and adoption. We planned to pursue adoption down the road after we'd had a few kids, but God had other plans. We were married in 2014, miscarried in 2015, and, after not getting pregnant again, we began the adoption process in 2016. God had put adoption on both of our hearts prior to marriage and we were excited to see how He would bless our family through it. We started paperwork with New Horizons in December of 2016, were an active family with them in June, started paperwork with An Open Door in July, and were an active family with them in September. In October we were matched with a mom due any day, but 10 days later we were told that the mom had changed her mind. It all happened so quickly that it almost felt like a miscarriage. We were heartbroken but continued to trust that God had good plans for us and our family. On December 13th, we got the call that we were matched again with a baby girl due in January and we accepted the match on the 15th. On the 22nd we found out we were pregnant and on the 29th our baby girl was born. It was a crazy, chaotic, and wonderful couple of weeks! We packed our bags and

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started the 17-hour drive to Georgia. Her birthday is exactly 1 year and a day after we first started our adoption journey. Minutes before picking up our baby girl I received an email that we would be given a grant from Katelyn's Fund. God had answered another prayer! It has been amazing to watch Him work through this whole journey. We met with the Katelyn's Fund board for our grant interview a few weeks before Kezlyn was born. We were so blessed by the support, conversations, and prayer we received that night. Just knowing that they were covering us with prayer and trusting in God's plan to grow our family with us was a huge blessing. Kezlyn and Kendrix are an answer to prayer and we are so thankful for our sweet babies. Kendrix was born in August, 8 months and a day after Kezlyn was born. 

What does this look like when it is all under one roof? DAVE SINKGRAVEN, pastor and adoptive father, will guide our thoughts and hearts through this conversation.

February 19: Father's Night

Tony is a licensed clinical social worker specializing in many areas including family and play therapy, attachment issues, and PTSD. September 13: Tools For School

We will learn from a professional guidance counselor ways to advocate for the needs of our children and ways to support the school system as well.

October 11: Understanding is Everything

Not only will you be going home with new information on how to help your children, you will also be taking home a "yes jar" which will help you combat the many negative effects of complex developmental trauma.

November 8: Shifts In Thinking

Invite anyone and everyone involved in your child's life to tonight's training. We will start the night off developing an understanding of how traditional approaches will not work for children from hard places and what approaches will help our children succeed.

December 6: Marriage Matters

God's design for marriage is to reflect Christ and His church. Reflecting the glory and beauty of Christ in marriage is a significant challenge then sprinkle in adoption and foster care and now marriage often faces an all out assault. It is God's desire that our marriages be Christ-centered, rather than child-centered. Is this even possible with the needs of our children. Loren De Jong will help us find the answer from personal and professional experience.

January 10: Just Breathe

Tonight will be so fun! You are invited to take your children with you to this training! We will explore practical ways to stay regulated AND easy ways to calm down when they become dysregulated. Following a short time of learning, parents and their children will have the opportunity to make various items to take home to aid in regulation.

February 7: Set Up For Success

Come learn as we focus on what we can do to empower our children's brains and bodies in order to help them be successful in day to day life. Not only will you be equipped with new regulation strategies, you will also go home with a cup full of ideas!

March 14: Tammy Lias and Chelle Bisenius

We will learn from Tammy Lias from Journey Therapy at the Barn about popular therapies of EMDR, Nuerofeedback/ Brain Paint, and Play Therapy. We will also learn from Chelle Bisen who has been involved in the foster care and adoptive system for over 20 years.

April 11: Fundamentals of Behavioral Change

Come as we explore how increasing connection and building secure attachment is key in long term behavioral change. We will explore how nurture groups can be effective in building family bonds.

May 2: Foster and Adoptive Parent Panel

Seasoned foster and adoptive parents will share tangible strategies that they have used with their families. This will provide a glimpse into the foster and adoptive journey.
