Living Water – the Well doesn't dry up

Where do we go when we are parched? When we are so thirsty it seems nothing will quench our desire, nothing will fill that need. We go to the Well, the One who offers us living water; His spicket never runs out, never runs dry.

Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them." John 7:38

We walk with One Vision Orphanage, we have many opportunities to see and seek Him. As I was in Haiti in March, immediately I was overwhelmingly greeted with calls of my name, and grabbing of my arms and given a huge hug; not a pity or pretend hug but a full

out, wrap your whole body around you hug, not letting go for some time kind of hug. The depth of the sincerity drenched me with love. As I walked hand in hand, the bittersweet realities of caring for orphan set in, the simple sweet presence of Him in the eyes of the children and the pounding demands needed for their care. I was first gathered to look at the cook stove, only two burners were now working and it was taking quite some time and effort for the cooking ladies to prepare food for nearly 80 people – replacement cost \$3,500...drenched in need.

As I walked along, with singing in my ears and a little one on my hip, I was shown school books and progress being made by students - saturated in gratitude for His provision of the supply of the books last year. We continued walking and I was summoned to the kitchen where we were told by the government that is was "not up to code" – consumed with both stifled laughter and disgust. As we walked on, around the corner, my eyes were filled with delight as I had longed to see the

A Life Changer!

On December 27, 2016, my life was changing and God was working in more ways than I could have imagined on that cold morning. A group of 25 from Sioux Center was about to embark on a journey that only God could have orchestrated! This was my first experience going to Haiti and visiting an orphanage. I was excited to say the least but also feeling nervous because it was all so new.

Driving through the communities of Haiti was heartbreaking and instantly had an impact on my heart and my mind. I have never experienced living conditions like this before - pure poverty. When we entered the orphanage and I see some of the most joyous faces I have ever seen, I experienced pure joy! Stepping off the bus and meeting the kids, especially our sponsor child, was exciting! Throughout the week and throughout different activities our group was able to be with the kids and get to know them well and love on them well. I remember before the trip I felt sad for the kids in the orphanage because they did not have family to love them like they deserve. After being with the kids and putting a face to the orphan, I realized that I was thankful that God led the kids to this orphanage where they are taken care of, fed, school is available, they get to learn about God every day, have a family with Katelyn's Fund and the staff at One Vision Orphanage, and have each other. God was working in our group and especially in me. Although I was completely heartbroken throughout this trip I also experienced what pure joy is. My heart hurt at the thought of leaving them and also filled up with love because of meeting them. They showed me what contentment is and that happiness does not lie in the possessions we have but in doing what God is calling us to do and walking alongside Him in our lives.

Our group experienced very crazy flights home which I believe happened for very specific reasons. First, I think that the devil was working against us and trying to get us to focus on how unfortunate it was that we had to spend extra hours in airplanes and on airport floors. He wanted to steal our joy and excitement from the trip. He did not want us to share what God was doing in our lives. He was wrong. Second, I think that we had time together to stir up some emotions and ideas of how we could help Katelyn's Fund and the kids at One Vision. Between the 25 of us, we took 10 different flights home. A few of us drove a rental vehicle home from Rochester, MN. On that drive home we discussed what we could do to help. We knew that a transitional house was needed for the older kids that were reaching the young age of 16 years old. Haitian law requires them to leave the orphanage at this age unless there is an exemption filed. The exemption is not guaranteed and can be taken away - very scary. Can you imagine putting your 16 year old child on the street without a job, schooling, family support, no money, no home, and nowhere to go? Imagine what could happen to your 16 year old. It's very hard to think about. Sex trafficking and child slavery is very present in Haiti. These facts are what drove us to think up the Prime Rib Supper Benefit. God laid this on our hearts and he orchestrated every step of the way. He brought together a group that could work together joyfully in planning. He rose up those in the community to help with the event and buy tickets to the event. When we began seriously planning the benefit for Katelyn's Fund we thought if we could just get 200 people to walk through the door that would be an awesome goal. Although hopeful that we could fill New Life Reformed with 352 people, we just weren't sure that it was going to happen. God showed us very quickly that it was going to happen. That New Life would be filled. He really just moved mountains to get people to come hear about and support His children, His orphans. We were so thankful and moved by all the support! The night went so smoothly and we were able to raise more than we even thought we could! What a blessing!

So did I ever in a million years expect this kind of stirring of events to happen from a little trip to Haiti? No way! I felt God's presence in a way I have never felt before that trip. I believe that He was working hard for our group and on the hearts of our group. Not one of us came back the same person. We had a post trip meeting and we were challenged to not feel guilty about all that God has given to us but instead to go and use what God has given to us for His purpose and for what He is calling us to do.

precious older ones – they came with humbleness and huge smiles—it seems my cup overflowed and couldn't be contained. I was quickly summoned to the well – the deep well that provides clean water to not only our children but to the community. We have three faucets outside the wall where there are certain times of the day this water is available for free to those who come. There are lines upon lines for those that desperately need clean and safe water. Now I am pulled to the well with urgency, I am told, the well is broken again, not the kind of broken that we tried to fix before with a new part, but something much more – repairs costing nearly \$3,000....flooded with expense and concern.

We continue on, we see how the activity room is organized and tidy, pride exuding like a waterfall, showcasing their empowerment. We walk in the office where there is a new requirement by the government for the nurse to have a bed in the room for those needing care, cost \$200. Feeling a blend of emotions, like I need a drink of water and the desire to lay down in the heat of the day, drenching of the needs. He continues showing His faithfulness as we walk into the pantry and on this day, not every day, but this day, there is enough rice. As I hold sweaty and sweet hands, my mind thinks of the sweetness and hard in the things here and the trust these precious ones have in us loving them and helping them. They hope as we hear the news of the needs that we will see them, that when they go to the well to get water, evidence shows, nothing comes out, leaving them uncertain of how their literal thirst will be quenched. We know there is trust, poured out in their childlike faith, they ask, they pray and they wait. Then they pray and wait again.

We also know ministry, especially orphan care is on-going, the needs do not stop, feeling the pressure of being asked the question when back home, how much will you come to those needing to give as the "giving well"? How many times will you ask... will that well you are asking from get dried up? How much will you keep asking? Our answer can only be, as long as the need is there, we will ask, as long as we are seeking His face, we will ask, inviting others to come with us to the Living Well.

We know it is beyond us – we need a provider who doesn't run out or grow weary. One who not only meets but IS the highest standard, the only Savoir, Jesus Christ. He is the One who can supply for those waiting and praying for healing of a broken well.

My mind was flooded as I continued to walk with the children and the staff; listening, and thinking about so many things. I came home, as with so many other trips, asking Him to walk with us as closely as we listen, as we ask His thoughts on so many things. As we seek ways to understand what this bittersweet entanglement means to love an orphan so deeply and experience the costly ways in doing so, we are left at a place of being completely parched, so thirsty for something to quench this. We walk, to look with eyes fixed on Jesus, gaze not distracted by all the drowning waters or situations, but just like the trust of a child, going to faucet, knowing with certainty the water will flow out, providing more than is needed as in the trust of a child praying. We go to the Living Well, drenching ourselves fully in His presence, asking for Him to wash over us in the ways that we think, providing the things that we need, and cleansing us for all righteous.

A request of our readers - If anyone is interested in providing for well repairs or cooktop refurbishing, a medical bed, or monthly rice supply, we would rejoice in His providing flowing water through you.

Praying for Possibilities

Exit Strategies... it sounds so intentional and yet so cold. Our hearts ache as we think about our Haiti kids "aging out" and what that means for them. We know like a successful carpenter, they need tools, things to help them. We know education is a huge factor that is life changing for children and their trajectory for success. Without it, you cut down so many opportunities while "limits" seem to skyrocket.

We were able to travel to UCI Haiti, a Christian college in Haiti, about 6 hours from the orphanage. They are an accredited school that offers degrees in agriculture, education, medicine, business, and theology. Tuition is \$1,600 per year for each student. They have dormitory housing and students are given two meals a day. The directors are Spirit filled and walking close to His heart. Leaders, Kristi and Jean Jean Mompremie exceed excellent standards and speak empowerment that is aligned with our shared belief in helping shift thinking and lives by giving opportunities beyond learning "how to fish"... but learning "how to learn" which creates endless possibilities.

There are many great parts of the university that impressed us – the high quality of teachers, the faculties, the sense of community, and their ethical and dignifying values. But the very

best part is that it is a Christian university, where things are taught and spoken in His Truth. We pray that this will be a partnership and path open to our Haiti children. We know there will be much hard work needed on the part of students to pass the exams. Also, hard decisions like building on to the school, hiring more teachers, and raising funds for the older student's tuition

to the school for those outside the orphanage walls also exist for UCI and those who support it. We praise Him for the opportunity to see UCI and we pray He opens doors for many to go there.

One thing that my husband and I shared was a heart to adopt an orphan child. However, after having three of our own children, we weren't sure if we could handle more. At one point, we thought we could start, but seeing how complicated the process was and how expensive adoption could be we thought we should best close that dream. But God had other plans. Last August, we received an email from an adoption agency that we inquired with. They knew we were American expats living and working in China. In the email was an "unusual" request to provide temporary care for a recently, adopted Chinese child. Because the adopted parents ran into some problems with US immigration, they could not bring this child into the States. Both the parents and the adoption agency were asking if we could provide temporary care while the parents go back to the States to appeal this decision. After asking our children for their permission, we opened our home to this 6 year old child with special needs- praying that she and her family would soon be reunited again. But sadly, after two months of living with us, the family of the adopted child would have no other options but to nullify their adoption, making her an orphan again. At that point, we felt conflicted. The adopted family and the adoption agency both were hinting to our family that it would be great if she could have "a family like yours." We didn't know what God's will was at that point. We knew what the costs (emotionally, financially and timewise) would be because she had already lived with us two months and we weren't sure if we wanted to pay that cost. However, we didn't have peace. One day, after prayer, I suddenly knew what we needed to do. I went back home and my husband at the same time said he wanted to talk. He reminded us of our conviction that if the Lord brought a child to us, we would not turn our backs on this child. Wasn't this the child that the Lord has brought into our lives? We knew that the journey would definitely not be easy, but we finally knew what the Lord's will was and we had peace. We can also trust Him to provide the money that we thought we could never afford. The grant provided by Katelyn's Fund was part of the beautiful plan God had from the beginning. It's His way of showing that He would take care of us, as we take care of His orphan child. Since then, God provided one miracle after another. He's allowed the Civil Affairs' official to grant this child to stay with us during the adoption process. We are so grateful that Katelyn's Fund was God's tangible source of help and encouragement that we so needed.

Even before landing in the US we knew that we were going to be back soon for an older child. After continued prayer upon our return we entered the adoption process again less than six months after getting home.

Working at a church is not the most profitable career choice and we knew that God was going to need to show up if we were going to follow His calling. We were confident He would provide and excited for the witness we could claim as funding showed up in record time. Through lots of hard fundraising work and a handful of generous grants like Katelyn's Fund we met our funding goal with a month to spare. The beautiful thing was that funds always seemed to show up at the right time. Just as we would learn that another fee was due we would receive a donation and at the end we knew that a large amount of fees were needed that we didn't yet have. Thank God Katelyn's Fund was able to close most of this gap. It was an enormous blessing and helped give us the peace to prepare for meeting our son without the looming stress of debt or upraised funds hanging over us.

It was as if this picture jumped off the cell phone into my heart. It was a God moment. I wrote Kyra to see if this was truly her as she looked so amazing and strong. She wrote me and yes this was Cai Xin Xin!!!! My heart was filled with joy! She went on to tell me that she just took her first few steps and was full of joy and smiles. She told me more about her and how much she adored her. Through this huge blessing from the Lord we knew she was ours! Our fears were gone and we have never looked back. 
